### **HS2 UPDATE**

For the past four years, members of EPC have regularly attended (albeit via Zoom these days) HS2 engagement meetings. Parishioners, it's getting scary! Construction of the route is well underway in parts of the country and is heading this way shortly. Many roads have been upgraded to manage increased levels of traffic; for example, junction 11 of the M40 at Banbury is near completion, a new access has been installed at Greatworth off the Welsh Lane and work is currently underway on the Radstone Rd. Next up is (more) single lane closures until the end of November on the A43 from Northampton to move materials in this direction.

Over on the A422 just before Westbury, work is starting immediately building two compounds, one to the north of the road, one to the south. This is in addition to the compound between the BP garage and Radstone and one at Mixbury. This is to enable HS2 to start building the viaduct in the direction of Mixbury and a cutting in the direction of Turweston. We are told this is a priority, and will precede any works at Mixbury. However, to necessitate this, there will be up to 1200 lorry movements (that's 600 in and 600 out) along the A422 from the A43. HGVs will not be allowed to travel in the direction of Buckingham and HS2 is building an access road to ensure lorries only turn left so don't interrupt the flow of traffic.

As soon as we have information about traffic movements along the A43/A421, we will circulate it and put it on the website.

## Remembrance Sunday





### **Act of Remembrance Service**

**GATHERING:** All gather in silence

The presiding minister reads the following sentence: "God is our refuge and strength; a very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46.1)The presiding minister continues: We meet in the presence of God. We pray for all who in bereavement, disability and pain continue to suffer the consequences of fighting and terror. We remember with thanksgiving and sorrow those whose lives, in world wars and conflicts past and present, have been given and taken away. As a community we gather to remember.

Let us remember before God, and commend to his safe keeping, those who have died for their country in war; those whom we knew and whose memory we treasure; and all who have lived and died in the service of the peoples of the world.

Representatives come forward to lay wreaths. A list of those to be remembered by name is read.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old; age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them. All: We will remember them.

O God of truth and justice, we hold before you those whose memory we cherish, and those whose names we will never know. Help us to lift our eyes above the torment of this broken world, and grant us the grace to pray for those who wish us harm. As we honour the past, may we put our faith in your future; for you are the source of life and hope, now and for ever. Amen.
