# Financial update

In February, Evenley Parish Council set its budget at £26,562 for 2024-24. This equates to an annual increase of £8 for a band D property. Councillor in charge of finance Spencer Burnham explained: "This small increase will allow us to keep pace with increasing electricity, insurance and other fixed costs but because of our prudence over the last few years, we can keep this increase to a minimum."

EPC has offered to share the cost of cutting the village green this Summer with Evenley Cricket Club (ECC). During the cricket season (May to September), ECC has historically paid for the green to be cut on a weekly basis whilst the parish council pays for its maintenance and cutting outside of this period. Whilst our cricket club is in fine financial health, it has invested heavily in enhancing the wicket and outfield alongside the parish council's programme of improving the outfield. Working together both organisations have improved the overall look and condition of the village green, which is after all our main asset of the village. In recognition of the cricket clubs investment in the green, Councillors voted to share the cost of the grass cutting for Summer 2024.





Thursday 8th June marks the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings. This was the largest naval, air and land operation in history involving hundreds of thousands of personnel who had to leave their families not knowing if they would ever return home. Sadly many did not. Over 154,000 troops from eight allied nations boarded 6,000 vessels to cross the English Channel setting down on five Normandy beaches. 24,000 allied paratroopers and glider infantry drifted down from above, skirting 88mm guns. Allied fighter pilots patrolled the perimeters of the landings establishing an aerial umbrella and bombers cratered local enemy airfields in addition to rail and road centres. This combined action brought about the eventual liberation of north-west Europe from Nazi occupation.

# **Anaerobic Digester Update**

As you will be aware, at West Northamptonshire Council's strategic planning committee meeting in December last year, the application to build one of the UK's largest anaerobic digesters was turned down by committee members. This was against the advice of WNC's planning officer who had recommended it for approval.

A massive thank you to all the villagers who turned up to the meeting to support the team with this. It may not be over yet; the applicant, Acorn Bioenergy has six months to launch an appeal. EPC and a small team of residents is working behind the scenes to ensure we are ready should Acorn appeal. Should it decide to do so, WNC will inform HM Inspectorate of Planning and an inspector will be appointed. That person will then determine the type of appeal and the timescale.

Chairman Cathy Ellis explains: "As soon as we have any news, we will be in touch with residents. Everyone pulled together before and we will need to do so again if Acorn appeal the decision.

Please make sure you are signed up for emails as this is the quickest way we can get in touch."

You may recall that the ladies of Evenley WI made over 350m of bunting for Coronation Day last year to decorate Evenley Green.
