


Chicane

Thanks to the HS2 Community Fund and Northamptonshire Highways, Evenley now has a speed restriction chicane on Broad Lane. There may be teething problems, but this together with the 'single track' signage on Mixbury Lane and the 'No HGV' sign at the top of Broad Lane and the vehicle activated signs will hopefully reduce both speeding traffic and drivers using the village as a rat run. We are still pushing for more 30 mph repeater signs on Broad Lane and are also about to put together a proposal for a reduced speed limit to 40mph on Bicester Hill and similarly on Mixbury Rd and Charlton Road.

Rubbish!

Whilst it is lovely to see so many visitors to Evenley, they bring a hundredweight of rubbish with them. Thank you to Paul and Angie at the Red Lion, Rose at Forge Coffee and other residents who have been helping clear away the debris. Unfortunately, South Northamptonshire Council won't allow us any more bins, so we are relying on volunteer help. EPC is looking at solutions but until we have solved this, may we respectfully ask residents to take their rubbish home, or use bins elsewhere in the village, particularly dog owners! Clearing away rubbish is not the most fun activity in the world as it is (and we are just residents too); clearing away other people's dog waste plumbs new depths! Hopefully once things return to normal, the problem will disappear so thank you for your understanding.



Village Hall Update

Obviously, the village hall is still closed. As soon as it is allowed to reopen it will, and residents and users will be informed immediately. Meanwhile, the committee is pleased to welcome Derek Haynes to the team. Derek replaces Chris Hart and will be responsible for outside maintenance.

The Annual General Meeting, scheduled to take place on 8th June was postponed, nevertheless the management of the hall and the control of its finances has continued and in order to demonstrate complete transparency we are now able to publish the annual accounts for the year ending 31st March 2020. Footpaths

During the coronavirus pandemic, many of us have been making full use of the wonderful walks in our area. Evenley has many footpaths, which can be found on our website evenleypc.org.uk under village information. These connect with great walks outside the parish. For example, you can leave the village and head towards Juniper and onto Cottisford or Hethe, or across the A43 to the remains of the old medieval village of Astwick. You can then follow this footpath towards Croughton, returning back towards Brackley on a delightful footpath that takes you to St James's Lake. Full details of the many walks in this area can be found on OS Map Explorer 191 Banbury, Bicester & Chipping Norton (and Brackley), available at Brackley Bookshop and online the Ordnance Survey website.

If you are out walking with or without your dog, please remember to stick to footpaths and to follow the countryside code (if you need reminding it's on www.gov.uk (or google 'countryside code'!)

Two new gates, funded by the HS2 Community Fund, will soon be fitted on footpaths leading out towards Evenley Wood, which will replace old stiles, and repeater signs have been added to other footpaths to help walkers find the route. If you find any problem gates, stiles or posts that we may have missed, please contact the clerk.
