
As there were fewer candidates than needed, the local elections did not include a ballot paper for Evenley Parish Council.

This service also includes additional drop off points allowing passengers to reach their local GPs and medical appointments, as well as occasional services to Banbury Centre.

We offer a range of different membership options from Bronze through to Gold, depending on the level of assistance you need. Bicester Hill update

Thank you to everyone who offered their support in our campaign to reduce the speed limit on Bicester Hill to 40mph. Sadly this has been turned down. The reason... here goes...

"In terms of setting appropriate speed limits we (Highways community liaison and the safer roads team leader for Northamptonshire Police). take the pragmatic view that if they do not command driver understanding or respect, not only will they be frequently contravened but they undermine the whole road safety regime. In other words the road environment should provide a clear illustration as to why a particular speed limit has been imposed and encourage self-compliance.

The roads around Evenley are typical of the vast majority of rural network around the county and the UK in general. These roads tend to bend and undulate; vary in width; present the occasional farm, property or dwelling frontage and are used by walkers, cyclists and horse riders to access amenities and the local country side. They generally allow motorists to make safe progress within the national speed limit of 60mph. Bicester Hill on the approach to the village typically reflects this function and environment, and these characteristics remain relatively consistent right up to the confines of the village where the road environment changes dramatically and a 30mph is entirely appropriate. It is universally accepted that every section of road network represents a risk to one type of road user or another and it is impossible to totally eliminate those risks.

The Panel therefore considers that the current limit remains appropriate particularly as it 'looks and feels 'like a national speed limit section of road. It is also apparent that the vast majority of motorists were travelling lower than the posted limit on the approach to the village and therefore well within the posted speed limit."
