Brackley Community Hospital Trust 2020

Mentioned already in this newsletter, EPC (and others in the village) is supporting this vital organisation which will benefit all residents in the area and has already made a small donation. The trust has been set up with the simple aim of purchasing extras for Brackley's new community hospital. Due to open later this year, this truly cutting edge facility will combine Brackley Medical Centre with rooms for visiting consultants, physiotherapy and occupational health facilities and more, x-ray and scanning services as well as 16 community hospital beds for recovering patients and palliative care. As well as raising money for a state of the art digital X-ray machine, the trust is hoping to kit out the rooms with those extras that the NHS can't fund but make a real difference to occupants' lives. For example one aim is to fit each room with a television and reclining chair. Typically a tv will cost approximately £500 and a chair just over £1,000. Wouldn't it be great if this village could raise enough funds to fit out just one of those rooms?

EVENLEY NEEDS YOU!


We need you to join in our VE day celebrations on Bank Holiday Friday 8th May 2020! The nation is celebrating the 75th anniversary of this momentous day when the guns fell silent at the end of the war in Europe. Years of carnage and destruction had come to an end and millions of people took to the streets and pubs to celebrate peace, mourn their loved – ones and to hope for the future, but not forgetting those still in conflict until 15th August when it was announced that Japan had surrendered unconditionally to the Allies, effectively ending World War II.

Around the world, there will be a three-day international celebration that will take place from 8th May to 10th May 2020. Here in Evenley, we are joining in with a giant picnic on the Green. Tents will be erected in case of inclement weather - but bring a pop up tent too if you have one - and there will be music from 1pm by 1940's style band, The Sasparillas. Teas and cakes will be on offer, with monies from these and a raffle raised donate to Brackley's new community hospital fund. And of course, we are hoping you will all come along dressed in your 1940s glad rags.


HS₂ Fund

Evenley Parish Council (EPC) successfully applied to the HS2 Community Environment Fund for a set of steel goals for the Green, a roller for Evenley Cricket Club, a new boiler and other items for Evenley Village Hall, a traditional wrought iron sign for the village to be erected outside the hall and some stiles for our footpaths. Thank you very much to the team who helped build the goals last week.

Collectively we received a £20,592 grant from HS2's Community Environment Fund, which has been created by HS2 to add benefit to communities along the route that are demonstrably disrupted by the construction of phase one of HS2 from London to West Midlands.

Councillors regularly attend HS2 liaison meetings, (minutes for which can be found on our website) and are attending a meeting with neighbouring villages this week to be advised detailed plans of local disruption.







Following on from our successful village clean up two years ago, we are organising another one, on Saturday 21st March. Once again this links in with Keep Britain Tidy's national clean up week and helps us maintain such a lovely village. With cuts in services, it is even more vital that we do our bit with to pick up litter and undertake minor maintenance and to this end we are planning a great Evenley tidy-up on Saturday 21st March at 10.30 for a couple of hours.

We will meet at the village hall and hand out hiviz jackets, litter pickers and rubbish bags to gather rubbish, wash some road and footpath signs and any other jobs that we can fit in on the day. Please bring your own gloves and dress appropriately. Children welcome, but they must be accompanied by a responsible adult and be suitably dressed.

We do however recognise that many people may not be available that day, but would be able to carry out some jobs at other times. If you could help with any of the jobs listed below, please contact Cathy E or Jeff. Materials will be provided and all help is gratefully received; 'many hands make light work'!
