AD Update

Acorn Bioenergy has notified Evenley Parish Council and residents that it intends to reapply for planning permission to build an anaerobic digester here in the parish at the same location as previously, just off Barley Mow roundabout. Its previous application was turned down by West Northamptonshire's Strategic Planning Committee in December 2023 (see below). At a recent meeting with Acorn representatives, councillors learnt that the new plant, whilst visually smaller than previously applied for would process the same quantity of crops and animal waste (97,000 tonnes). When Acorn was asked what this meant in terms of traffic movements, EPC was advised that Acorn has now employed new consultants and that all the transport figures in the previous application were wrong. EPC and residents had argued this point vociferously dur-

ing the last application. We asked Acorn how residents will be able to trust its figures in its new application.

Residents have been asked by Acorn to take part in a 'consultation process'. You do not need to respond however, as this is not a formal part of the application, it is a process for Acorn to gather information. EPC has advised residents who object to this application and wish to respond to state that they do not support the plant and do not believe in its 'green credentials'.

When Acorn has made its application we will call another public meeting to discuss our response but in the meantime, as advised

at our recent meetings, please do not hesitate to ask if you need advice or help with this matter.

In December 2023 Acorn's previous application was turned down for the reasons specified below: "It is considered the scale height and massing of the proposed development will not minimise the adverse impacts on people and the natural environment. As such it will have an unacceptable impact on the landscape character of the surrounding area contrary to policies S1 and S11 West Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy (2014)." These policies specifically refer to protecting rural areas and not permitting industrialisation countryside.



We always need more volunteers but between us we covered 15 sessions - an average of four sessions a week".
